

HISTORY OF BEER

Ancient Sumeria which did encompass modern day Iran and Iraq has long been known as the “Cradle of Civilization” likely because one of the most important “inventions” made there...BEER! Whether on purpose or by accident the discovery of beer some 6000 years before Christ’s birth is well regarded as one of the greatest gifts to civilization. Any mixture containing sugars and starches can ferment along with rain water it’s most likely that beer was discovered, not made. A pot with wheat and fruit filled with water and left to sit likely fermented into some sort of Mead that in turn evolved into modern day beer. It was a staple of Kings and Queens in Ancient Egypt who offered it to the Gods and Chinese nobles were known to drink beer 5000 years ago. The ancient Greeks learned the process and perfected it taught it to the Romans who brought it to the isle of Britannia where Brits and Scots put their own distinct twist on the “Nectar of the Gods.” Hops, now a staple ingredient of most beers, were likely introduced by a Belgian Monk back in the 800s (thank you for that by the way!) Hops were first planted in England back in 1428 when one of the oldest breweries was started. Since then breweries have been mass producing beer for centuries. In 1516 William IV of Bavaria set Germany’s still standing Reinheitsgebot or Purity Law that is one of the longest standing food production regulations known to man, of course it was started with beer. The Industrial Revolution in the 1700’s lead to great strides in mechanizing all aspects of the world including brewing. Mass production of beer was sparked during this time as both brewing and bottling were made easier and more efficient, which is when brewing became a real profitable business. When Prohibition arrived in the United States, brewing went underground and in essence gave birth to Home Brewing, which is practiced by millions of Americans and gave birth to microbrewery after microbrewery which had lead to 500 beers gracing our shelves and tap lines. From monster corporate breweries like the one down on Pestalozzi to smaller production plants like the one on Southwest, brewing beer is beyond a hobby and is turning in the a multi-billion dollar business every year. Beer is a business that has survived thousand of years, hundred of temperance attacks and dozens of recessions. While it will be long debated who actually “invented” beer, here centuries later the “who” matters less than the “what”. Whether lager or ale, lambic or stout, amber or Oktoberfest beer has taken on many different styles, looks and tastes in its evolvment. From a forgotten pot in ancient Iraq to the hi-tech lines of iTAP is a certainly long journey but we are glad beer made the trip and we know you are as well. Cheers, Prost, Salud and L’chiem!

BOTTLE MENU

LAGERS

One of two main types of beer (Ale being the other). The primary difference between the two is that lager yeast is bottom fermenting and ferments at lower temperatures for longer periods of time (hence the definition). There are several varieties of Lagers with varying taste and alcohol. Lagers: Typically light in color and virtually transparent. Taste characteristics are typically light in nature with a minimal amount of hops and malt.



ALES

This category of beer uses yeast that ferments at the “top” of the fermentation vessel, and typically at higher temperatures than lager yeast (60°-75°F), which, as a result, makes for a quicker fermentation period (7-8 days, or even less). Ale yeast are known to produce by-products called esters, which are “flowery” and “fruity” aromas ranging, but not limited to apple, pear, pineapple, grass, hay, plum, and prune.



MOST COMMON BEER STYLES

AMERICAN DOUBLE/IMPERIAL PILSNER

Similar to a Pilsner in appearance, but expect a more pronounced malty backbone and an intense bitterness. Malt flavors tend to be quite sweet in many examples. Alcohol can be quite aggressive and lend some spicy notes to the flavor. You may begin to notice a trend in some of our descriptions...American Craft brewers doing things in a bigger-bolder manner.

BOCK

Bock beer in general has a higher ABV than your typical lager. There also typically have more malt flavor and they pour anywhere from dark amber to brown. You won't catch much hop flavor in these beers. Be warned, the Bock is a gateway drug his big brother further down the menu...Doppelbock.

CZECH PILSENER

The Czech Pilsner, is light golden color crystal clear. Hops are prevalent, to a small degree. Smooth and crisp with a clean malty palate. Generally they have a very full-bodied flavor and are darker than their baby brother "Bock" and they have higher levels of alcohol too. They range in color from dark amber to nearly black.

EISBOCK

A unique brew to be sure (we only have one on the menu!). Eisbocks are created by freezing off a portion of the water, and removing it from the beer. By removing the water it increases the beers flavor and ABV. You will notice a nice malt character, with a light lager type finish. At 12% you will taste the alcohol...just thought we'd let you know.

GERMAN PILSNER

Classic German Pilsners are very light and golden in color. The head will be very thick and rich. They are also well-hopped for a lager. A great style of beer that can be enjoyed many times over. The beer nerds (their own term, not ours) like to call them "Session Beers"

MAIBOCK

Lighter in color than other Bock beers and generally has a higher hop character. The ABV is also a touch higher the other Bock's. Maibocks were traditionally served in the spring and as they were oftentimes interrelated with spring festivals and celebrations more often in the month of May. These days however the beer is brewed year round.

MARZEN/OKTOBERFEST

Märzenbier is full-bodied, rich, toasty, typically dark copper in color with a medium to high alcohol content. If you don't want to try one today, come back for our Oktoberfest celebration.

MUNICH DUNKEL LAGER

An old friend of Bavaria, Munich Dunkels are smooth, rich and complex, but without being heavy. They boast brilliant ruby hues from the large amounts of Munich malts used, and these malts also lend a fuller-bodied beer. Bitterness is often moderate, with just enough to balance out any sweetness.

MUNICH HELLES LAGER

When the golden and clean lagers of Plzen (Bohemia) became all the rage in the mid-1800's, München brewers feared that Germans would start drinking the Czech beer vs. their own. Munich Helles Lager was their answer to meet the demand. "Helles" is German for "bright."

RAUCHBIER

The Rauchbier style is an old German beer style, its origins go back to the 1500's and to the district of Franconia and the town of Bamberg. It's typically of dark colour and has similarities of the Oktoberfestbier. Green malts are literally dried over an open fire of beech wood, imparting a unique smokiness ("rauch" is German for smoke), the usage of which produces beers of an acquired taste.

SCHWARZBIER

Schwarzbier ("shvahrts-beer"), is simply German for black beer. It doesn't mean that it's necessarily heavy or light in body, although they tend to lean towards light. Unlike other dark beers, like porters or stouts, they are not overly bitter with burnt and roasted malt characteristics that the others tend to depend on. Instead, hops are used for a good portion of the bitterness.

MOST COMMON BEER STYLES

ALTBIER

“Alt” translates to “old” in German, and traditionally Altbiers are conditioned for a longer than normal periods of time. The extended conditioning mellows out the ale’s fruitiness and produces an exceptionally smooth brew. The color ranges from amber to dark brown, medium in carbonation with a great balance between malt and hops.

AMBER ALES

Anything less than a Dark Ale in color, ranging from amber (surprised?) to deep red hues. This style of beer tends to focus on the malts. You will get a well balanced beer, with toasted malt characters and a light fruitiness.

AMERICAN BLONDE ALE

Similar in nature to a German style Kölsch, but truly the creation of the American Craft Brewers. Color is light yellow to gold but malts are the main feature in this brew. With a light to medium hop bitterness

AMERICAN PALE ALE

Of British origin, this style has been embraced by the American Craft Brewers. Expect a good balance of malt and hops. American Pale Ales tend to be more hoppy than the original British versions.

AMERICAN STRONG ALES

If you are reading this you are reading about beers that have an ABV of 7.0% or higher. Some may even be as high as 25% abv. Look and taste characteristics vary widely, some have similarities to Barleywines and Old Ales (these styles are explained below).

AMERICAN WHEAT ALES

An Americanized version of a Dunkelweizen, these beers can range within the brown to garnet range. Often cloudy, with long-lasting heads and a light to medium body with high levels of carbonation.

AMERICAN WILD ALE

Since we only have one of these available, we will just tell you what the brewer tells us. An artisan amber ale brewed in the Flanders tradition. Deep amber with earthy caramel, spice, and sour fruit notes developed through natural barrel aging. Unfiltered, unpasteurized and blended from barrels ranging in age from two to ten months.

BARLEYWINES

Despite its name, a Barleywine is a beer, albeit a very strong and complex beer! The taste ranges from fruity, to sweet to bitter. The only constant between the brewers is the high ABV. A brew of this strength and complexity can be a challenge to the palate. Color will range from amber to dark brown. Body is thick, alcohol will definitely be tasted, and flavors can range from fruits to tongue tickling hops.

BELGIAN DARK ALE

Belgian Darks offer a massive range of characters. Colors play within the amber to light brown to deep garnet hues, with thick, rocky heads of great retention and beautiful lacing. Flavors from dry and spiced, to sweet and malty. You won’t get a hop fix with these beers, but they are brewed by World Class brewers which produces an impressive finished product.

BELGIAN PALE ALE

Belgium is Beautiful! After we pour this beer you notice the beautiful colors that range from pale yellow to amber. Most will be crowned with thick, fluffy cloud like heads that will leave their mark down the entire glass. Don’t be shy, stick your face in the glass in and get a good whiff of all the wonderful aromas.

BELGIAN STRONG DARK ALE

On the same path as the Belgian Dark Ale but, you guessed it, with a higher ABV and a more complex taste. The alcohol character can be deceiving so don’t let these beauty’s fool you.

BIER DE GARDE

The Biere de Garde is golden to light brown in color. Toasted malt aroma and slight sweetness summarize this beer. Many are bottle conditioned.

BITTERS

The Bitter style came from brewers who wanted to be different and bring a higher level of hop bitterness to their product. Most have a gold or copper color and are generally light bodied.

MOST COMMON BEER STYLES

BROWN ALES

Brown Ales tend to be malty with a full body. Color can range from reddish brown to dark brown.

DUBBEL

The Belgian Dubbel is a rich malty beer with some spicy / phenolic and mild alcoholic characteristics. Not as much fruitiness than the Belgian Strong Dark Ale but some dark fruit aromas and flavors may be present. Mild hop bitterness with no lingering hop flavors. It may show traits of a steely caramel flavor from the use of crystal malt or dark candy sugar. Look for a medium to full body with an expressive carbonation.

DUNKELWEIZEN

Similar to a Hefeweizen, these southern Germany wheat beers are brewed as darker versions (Dunkel means “dark”) complex malts and minimal bitterness. Most are brown and hint of bananas.

ENGLISH PALE ALE

This ale can be from golden to reddish amber in color with generally a good head retention. A mix of fruity, hoppy, earthy, buttery and malty aromas and flavors can be found.

ENGLISH STRONG ALE

Bigger than a Pale Ale yet smaller than a Barleywine the English Strong Ale is a rich and complex beer. Many are unfiltered and bottle conditioned. The color tends to land somewhere between amber and reddish copper. They usually have a bold fruity, estery and malty mix. Hops can vary from mild bitterness to a full blown hop character with a bold hop flavor and aroma. The alcohol can be quite noticeable, a hint of solvent is possible.

FLANDERS RED ALE

A Flanders Red, are commonly referred to as the “red” beers of West Flanders. Belgian Red Beers are typically light-bodied brews with reddish-brown colors. They are infamous for their distinct sharp, fruity, sour and tart flavours which are created by special yeast strains. Very complex beers, they are produced under the age old tradition of long-term cask aging in oak, and the blending of young and old beers.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLE

Self Explanatory?

HEFEWEIZEN

A south German style of wheat beer (weissbier) made with high levels of wheat. Little hop bitterness, and a moderate level of alcohol. The “Hefe” means “with yeast”, which leads to the beers unfiltered and cloudy appearance. Poured into a traditional Weizen glass, the Hefeweizen can be one sexy looking beer.

HERBED/SPICED BEER

This style takes on a beer that is specially herbed and or spiced. This is anything from the common spiced Fall Pumpkin beer to Christmas beers with nutmeg and cinnamon to ginger beers to heather ales. Some brewers will throw just about anything into the brew kettle; hot peppers, hemp, ginseng or spruce needles. Keep your mind open when you are trying some as brewers will always keep on trying to expand the limits of what beer is.

IPA (INDIA PALE ALE)

Stop me if you’ve already heard this one. There is a boat traveling from England to India...nevermind, we will stop ourselves. These beers are hoppy and we love it! The American Craft beer movement took a once withering English IPA and Americanized it with supersized hoppiness. There are countless varieties on the market today and they all vary in hop bitterness and ABV. You will also notice that many Belgium brewers are getting in on the act brewing a higher hopped IPA. You won’t hear any complaints from us.

IRISH RED ALE

A bit sweet, with a lightly hopped, Irish Red Ales are easy to please. Look for well-rounded and balanced flavors, and a pleasant toasted malt character in many examples. A drying finish is common.

KOLSCH

First only brewed in Köln, Germany, now many American brewpubs and a hand full of breweries have created their own version of this obscure style. Light to medium in body with a very pale color, hop bitterness is medium to slightly assertive. A somewhat vinous (grape-y from malts) and dry flavor make up the rest.

MOST COMMON BEER STYLES

KRISTALWEIZEN

A filtered version of a Hefeweizen, showcasing bright and clear bodies from pale straw to light amber. Overall character will be more clean and softer on the palate, and the common banana and phenols will be more subtle.

LAMBIC

In the case of Fruit Lambics, whole fruits are traditionally added after spontaneous fermentation has started. Kriek (cherries), Framboise (raspberries), Pêche (peach) and Cassis (black currant) are common fruits, all producing subtle to intense fruit characters respectively. Once the fruit is added, the beer is subjected to additional maturation before bottling. Malt and hop characters are generally low to allow the fruit to consumer the palate. Alcohol content tends to be low.

OLD ALE

Rich dark amber in color to a very dark brown; near black. Tamed aromatics. Although bittering levels can greatly vary, expect common fruitiness, intense malts and sharp alcohol characteristics. The often racy but mellow attitude of the beer may also include raisins and black currants. Stronger versions may have similarities to a port wine.

PORTER

Much like the IPAs, there are several varieties of the original. The hop bitterness range is quite wide but most are balanced. Many are just easy drinking session porters. The American Craft brewers have done a great job with this English creation, so don't forget to try some of the originals from England.

QUAD (QUADRUPEL)

Inspired by the Trappist brewers of Belgium, a Quadrupel is a Belgian style ale of great strength with bolder flavor compared to its Dubbel and Tripel sister styles. Typically a dark creation that ranges within the deep red, brown and garnet hues. Full bodied with a rich malty palate. Sweet with a low bitterness yet a well perceived alcohol.

SAISON/FARMHOUSE ALE

Saisons are sturdy farmhouse ale that was traditionally brewed in the winter, to be consumed throughout the summer months. Not so long ago it was close to being an endangered style, but over recent years there's been a massive revival; especially in the US. This is a very complex style, many are very fruit in the aroma and flavor. Look for earthy yeast tones, mild to moderate tartness. Lot of spice and with a medium bitterness. They tend to be semi-dry with many only having touch of sweetness.

SCOTTISH ALES

Scottish Ales traditionally go through a long boil in the kettle for a caramelization of the wort. This produces a deep copper to brown in colored brew and a higher level of unfermentable sugars which create a rich mouthfeel and malty flavors and aromas. Overall hop character is low, light floral or herbal, allowing its signature malt profile to be the highlight. Smoky characters are also common.

SCOTTISH ALE/WEE HEAVY

Scotch Ales traditionally go through a long boil in the kettle for a caramelization of the wort. This produces a deep copper to brown in colored brew. Compared to Scottish Ales, they'll be sweeter and fuller-bodied, and of course higher in alcohol, with a much more pronounced malty caramel and roasted malt flavor. A low tea-like bitterness can be found in many examples. Best served in a "thistle" glass.

STOUT

There are probably a ½ dozen different styles of stout, from the milk sweet, oatmeal or Russian Stouts. One thing they all have in common, they are dark! Ranging anywhere from dark brown to black. Flavors range from that of roasted coffee to oats

TRIPEL

The name "Tripel" actually stems from part of the brewing process, in which brewers use up to three times the amount of malt than a standard Trappist. Traditionally, Tripels are bright yellow to gold in color, which is a shade or two darker than the average Pilsner. Head will be big, dense and creamy. Tripels are actually high in ABV, but the best brewed versions hide it in a very deceptive manner

WINTER WARMER

These malty sweet offerings tend to be a favorite winter seasonal. Big malt presence, both in flavor and body. The color ranges from brownish reds to nearly pitch black. Hop bitterness is generally low, leveled and balanced, but hop character can be pronounced. Alcohol warmth is not uncommon.

WITBIER

A Belgian Style ale that's very pale and cloudy in appearance due it being unfiltered and the high level of wheat, and sometimes oats, that's used in the mash. The crispness comes from the wheat and the lively level of carbonation. Often referred to as "white beers" due to the cloudiness.
